What are cookies?

When you access a website, a cookie may be stored on your device (computer, tablet, or smartphone, for example) as a tiny amount of data or a message. Most websites make use of cookies. Cookies are used to enhance your browsing experience. Your web browser receives cookies from an organization's web server, which are subsequently saved on your hard drive. Cookies do not harm your system and cannot read data from cookie files on your hard drive or those made by other websites.

Why do we utilize cookies, and how?

Cookies are exclusively used by us to track website performance and enhance user experience. For this, Google Analytics is used. Analysis is carried out completely anonymously. We do not share any information with third parties because the remarketing elements of Google Analytics are not activated or used in our settings. Cookies are used by Google Analytics to analyze how users use a website, application, or service.

Your IP address and other information created by the cookie about how you use the website will be sent to and stored by Google on servers located in the United States. In order to compile reports on website activity for website operators and to provide other services connected to website activity and internet usage, Google will use this information to assess how you use the website, applications, or services. When required to do so by law or when such third parties process the information on Google's behalf, Google may also disclose this information to third parties. Your IP address won't be linked to any other information that Google stores.

Cookies come in a variety of forms:

Technical and necessary cookies

These cookies, which are generated directly by the platform that hosts the website, are necessary for the platform to operate properly. If you wish to visit our website, you cannot refuse these cookies.

Cookies for analytics

To provide you with more pertinent material in the future, these cookies track your preferences for using the website (such as your visit frequency and duration or the number and type of pages you see). Because analytical cookies are utilized anonymously, no specific person can be recognized from the data they produce.

Cookies for advertising

These cookies allow websites to recommend content based on your online browsing behaviors and interests. Although they won't disappear if you deactivate them, you'll see fewer ads that are pertinent to you.

Cookies for sharing content

These cookies, which are from third-party websites, allow users to share the website's content on social media. You can post the stuff you've seen on your profile and to your friends using the sharing features.

How is it possible to forbid the use of cookies?

You may decide whether to accept or reject cookies at any time by using the Cookies control panel or the browser settings on your device (computer, tablet, or smartphone, for example).

Cookies control panel

You can choose to accept or reject cookies of any origin or from a specific source, or you can choose to have a message appear asking for consent each time a cookie is put, depending on the type of browser you are using. Additionally, you may always remove previously saved cookies. We encourage you to look up online assistance for your browser.
